Reminder from the Dept of Public Works
Scheduled Leaf pick up will run from the Week of
October 15th to the Week of December 17th



The final Vegetative Waste Pick Up will be on Thursday October 25th.

During Leaf Season leaves should be placed at the curb no earlier than the weekend **prior** to your scheduled pickup. See calendar for your scheduled week.

To better serve you, the following is needed to facilitate the pick-up of leaves.....

- NO PLASTIC BAGS, GARBAGE CANS OR BOXES OF ANY KIND will be collected
- Pile leaves neatly at the curb so as NOT to obstruct traffic in the street
- Do NOT mix debris with leaves such as rocks, wood, branches, twigs, etc. (only grass clippings & leaves will be collected)
- Branches must be dropped off to the Recycling Center
- Leaves should NOT be piled around fire hydrants, light poles, signs, trees, etc.
- Leaves should NOT be placed closer than fifteen (15) feet to a stop sign
- DO NOT place leaves within ten (10) feet of either side of a storm drain or on top of it
- DO NOT place leaves prior to your scheduled collection week
- Vehicles parked in the street prevent us from working along the curb and collecting your leaves
- If you have a landscape contractor please inform them of the above-mentioned items

During April - October Vegetative waste, grass clippings, tree branches, and twigs are picked up curbside on Thursday. They must be placed in open containers or biodegradable bags (no plastic bags accepted). Branches must be no longer than four (4) feet in length and must be bundled and tied. Please do not leave branches in the roadway - they will not be picked up. If you have larger branches you must take them to the Recycling Center.

A maximum of five bundles per pick-up is permitted.

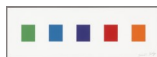


Magnolia (1966) by Ellsworth Kelly

We are fortunate that the Library has also been the beneficiary of two important gifts, the fine art print *Magnolia* (1966) by internationally renowned artist Ellsworth Kelly, who grew up in Oradell, and the Robert Milli Collection of films on DVD.

On the evening of Tuesday, July 24, 2018 we invited special guests and the public to the official unveiling of *Magnolia* (1966), donated by the Ellsworth Kelly Foundation to the Library in memory of the life-long friendship between former Borough Historian Frank R. Vierling and Ellsworth Kelly, initiated originally by a generous donation from Frank's daughter Elizabeth Vierling, which will be used to acquire other materials supporting the Local History Collection. The print, based on Ellsworth Kelly's plant drawing by the same name, hangs over the fireplace mantel in the Frank R. Vierling Memorial Reading Room opposite Ellsworth Kelly's *Color Squares 2* (2011) over the fireplace mantel in the South Reference Room.

The prominent modern artist Ellsworth Kelly (May 31, 1923 – December 27, 2015) grew up in Oradell and was childhood friends with Frank R. Vierling. While in Oradell, Ellsworth Kelly began his lifelong career in art and design, being inspired by the buildings in town and by the nature observed at Oradell Reservoir.

Acclaimed actor of stage, screen, and television, Robert Milli of Norwood, New Jersey, is a great friend to Oradell Public Library and an active member of its IFC Film Club. Known for playing Horatio to Richard Burton's *Hamlet* in the legendary Broadway production of 1964 as well as for his countless roles in films and in television soap operas, Mr. Milli has also shared at the Library his prodigious talents as a classically trained actor in his staged reading of *Hamlet* in 2017 and his presentation of O. Henry's "The Gift of the Magi" around Epiphany 2018, as well as contributing to the Library's first celebration of Bloomsday in June 2018.

When Mr. Milli needed to downsize for his eventual move to Norwood from nearby Harrington Park, New Jersey, he donated his vast collection of films on DVD to the Library, saying that he could think of no other institution for which his prized film library was better suited. The collection covers most of the classic films in the history of cinema and specializes in film noir and classic Hollywood productions.

In addition to all the upcoming offerings, we hope you and your friends will participate with us in another special event at Oradell Public Library:

Craft Beer Fundraiser, featuring John Holl, author of *Drink Beer, Think Beer: Getting to the Bottom of Every Pint* (2018), sponsored by the Oradell Book and Needle Club and the Oradell Public Library Foundation on **Saturday, October 20, 2018**, so **save** the date.

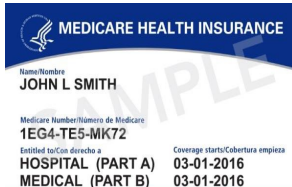

New Medicare cards are being issued by Social Security. The cards are **FREE.** Only your Medicare number is changing.

Your Social Security number remains the same. Your Medicare coverage and benefits will stay the same. Your new number is called Medicare Beneficiary Identifier (MBI) and is 11 characters, a mix of letters and numbers. Start using your new card as soon as you get it. Beginning January 1, 2020, you can only use the new Medicare card and new number. Be sure to destroy your old red, white and blue Medicare card.

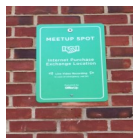


Daylight Savings Time is ending at 2 am on Sunday, November 4th. This not only means that you need to set your clocks back one hour, but that it will get dark earlier. It's a good time to remember a few simple safety tips: At home, keep a light on or adjust your timers so you will come home to a well-lit house. Illuminate your home address to assist the police in locating your address.

Section 180-11 of the Oradell Borough Code states, in part:



All residents of the Borough may register their name, address and/or unit/apartment number with the Municipal Clerk to be placed on the No-Knock List, indicating that they do not want canvassers, distributors, solicitors, peddlers, transient merchants or hawkers of any sort to approach their homes and/or seek personal contact with the occupants of the registered residence.

The Borough of Oradell offers the option to view and pay your Property Tax & Excess Sewer Usage Bills online at www.oradell.org.

Features and Benefits of Paying via E-Check, Credit or Debit Card:

- ⇒ It's convenient - residents can make a payment by e-check, credit or debit card 24 hours a day, 7 days a week.
- ⇒ It's safe and secure - standard, commercial card networks are used. The Borough **does not** receive or store account or card numbers.
- ⇒ There is a fee charged by service providers. These fees are based on the type and amount of your payment. The Borough does not receive any of these fees. Please see fee table below.
- ⇒ Payment information will not be disclosed for any reason other than processing the transaction authorized by the taxpayers.
- ⇒ A confirmation number is provided at the end of your transaction.

Fee Table:

There are fees associated with paying your bill online.

If you pay by E-Check, there is a \$1.05 convenience fee.

If you pay by Visa debit card, there is a \$3.95 convenience fee.

The fee for all other debit or credit card payments is 2.95% of your total bill.

Oradell is awarded \$2000 grant from Sustainable Jersey and the PSEG Foundation to develop a Wildlife Interaction Plan.

Great News! In May of 2018, the Borough of Oradell received a \$2,000 grant from Sustainable Jersey and the PSEG Foundation to establish a Wildlife Interaction Plan concerning coyotes in our community. A Coyote Task Force, comprised of borough officials, the Green Team, wildlife experts and residents, will work on the project.

Look for upcoming educational programs and information about the local coyote population.
