In this Newsletter, you will find a great deal of useful information not the least of which is an overview of the 2018 municipal budget. As always, our Borough Administrator, CFO, each of the Department Heads and the Council began working on this budget several

months ago and the budget that was introduced on March 27^{th} is a culmination of that effort. This budget provides many services to our residents while holding the municipal tax increase to 1.72%. The pages of this Newsletter provide some of the detail and if you have any questions, please do not hesitate to contact me or the Borough Administrator or CFO.

This budget also includes funding to complete the Master Plan for the Borough. The Master Plan Subcommittee of the Planning Board has been working for over a year in a very transparent and open process to capture a long-range vision for Oradell. The fourth public meeting will be held Saturday April 7th at Borough Hall, 2nd floor at 10 am. The Master Plan guides economic development, parks and recreation facilities, open space and natural resources, preservation of historic structures and many other issues. So please share your ideas and if you cannot make the public meeting please email your comments to mayor@oradell.org and I will forward them to the subcommittee.

Congratulations to our Green Team and the Beautification & Environmental Committee on achieving Sustainable Jersey recertification at the Bronze level. And congratulations to our Borough Employees on receiving the Gold Award at the JIF safety breakfast in March. Both of these awards recognize the teamwork that our employees and volunteers put forth to make Oradell a greener, safer, more sustainable community for everyone.

You will also find information about upcoming events such as the Get Fit Challenge, the Farmer's Market, the Library fundraiser, Earth Day, the Summer Recreation Program and Seniorcize to name a few. Please also join us on Memorial Day morning as we place wreaths at the several monuments in town that honor our Oradell veterans who made the ultimate sacrifice in service to our country.

I am looking forward to the town wide spring planting on May 6^{th} (we can use your help) and hoping that the weekly snowstorms will have stopped by then!

ORADELL Achieves Sustainable Jersey Certification

Oradell met the rigorous requirements to achieve Sustainable Jersey recertification at the Bronze Level. The borough is one of 152 towns in New Jersey with a Bronze certification. The Green Team



together with the Beautification & Environmental Committees is now beginning the work towards Silver level certification.

Oradell earned a total of 185 points for completing following actions: Fleet

Inventory, Prescription Drug and Safety Disposal Box, Sustainable Land Use Pledge, Community Education and Outreach, Hold a Green Fair, Community and School Gardens, Farmers Market, Anti-Idling Education and Enforcement Program, Support Local Business, Driver Training, Purchase Alternative Fuel Vehicle, Vehicle Conversions, Green Cleaning Products, Green Grounds and Maintenance Policy, Reusable Bag Education Program, Integrated Pest Management Policy, Community Paper Shredding, Recycling Depot, and Grass-Cut It and Leave It program.



Tax Collector

Tax Information is available online at www.oradell.org in Borough Departments (on the left), WIPP-Property Tax Inquiry. Click Property Tax Inquiry, then click on the link. Enter the information and hit search. Everyone is encouraged to view the website, but the Tax Office is still available for further assistance.

Direct withdrawal for payment of taxes is still available. Simply complete the form found online or in the Tax Department and submit it with a voided check to the Tax Department. Thereafter your tax payment will be debited from your checking account when each installment is due. You will never be late!

After hours mailbox is located by the rear doors of the Borough Hall. Correspondence and tax payments may be deposited here during and after Borough business hours.

Property Tax Reimbursement Program (Senior Freeze) is available for seniors and disabled persons. The eligibility requirements can be found on the Borough's website. The deadline to submit the application is October 31st. If you are new to the program, you may download the form and obtain further information at www.nj.us/treasury/taxation/ptr/index.shtml.

Tax Payments can be made online via the Borough's website (www.oradell.org). On the home page click on the "property tax information" tab. Once on that page, click on the link. A check or credit card can be used to make a payment on-line. There is a convenience fee of \$1.05 for a payment made with a check. Payments made with a Visa debit card cost an additional \$3.95 and any other credit card has an additional fee of 2.95% of the charge.

In 2017 Mayor Dianne Didio and the borough council gave approval to the Oradell Police Department under the direction of Chief William Wicker to participate in the Law Enforcement Support Organization (LESO) 1033 program.

The U.S. Department of Defense (DOD) 1033 Program permits the Secretary of Defense to transfer excess DOD supplies and equipment to state and local law enforcement agencies for use in their law enforcement duties. This property is procured at no cost to the agency with the exception of any shipping or transportation costs. In New Jersey, the program is under the operation and control of the New Jersey Office of Emergency Management.

During the past year, the Oradell Police has been actively obtaining equipment from various military bases along the east coast. Some of the equipment includes traffic speed radar signs, light towers, generators, office equipment, radios, and an extra pickup truck for traffic related details. Not only have we procured police equipment we have also acquired some equipment for our Department of Public Works. This program has allowed the police department to get a hold of otherwise expensive equipment at minimal or no cost. We look forward to continuing the program to acquire useful equipment for the borough without burdening our budget.

Wants to remind you that vegetative waste pickup has moved to

THURSDAYS

starting April 5th.

Vegetative waste, grass clippings, tree branches, and twigs are picked up curbside on Wednesdays from April through October. They must be placed in open containers or biodegradable bags (no plastic bags accepted). Branches must be no longer than four feet in length and must be bundled and tied. **A maximum of five bundles per pick-up is permitted**.

Please Note: waste bundles or containers may be placed at the curb after 5 pm on the day prior to regular collection and must be removed before 7:00 pm on the day of the collection, in accordance with Borough Code Chapter 190-6 (J) ("Property Maintenance"). No more than five containers weighing a maximum of 60 lbs. each will be picked up on any collection day.

SEWER LATERALS

Just a reminder that the Borough does not provide repair or service to any sewer lateral connected from private property to the main line. This would include the portion located in the street. The homeowner is responsible for all work and permits in connection with the repairs and service.

PROPERTY MAINTENANCE REMINDERS...



<u>Address numbers:</u>

New and existing buildings shall have approved address numbers, building numbers or approved building identification placed adjacent to the main entrance that is plainly legible and visible from the street. These numbers shall contrast with their background. Address numbers shall be Arabic numerals or alphabet letters. Numbers shall be a minimum of 4 inches high with a minimum stroke width of 0.5 inch. As per the Building Code and the Certificate of continued Occupancy.

Plantings by an intersection:

All brush, hedges, and other plant life growing within 10 feet of any roadway and within 25 feet of the intersection of two roadways shall be cut to a height of not more than 2 1/2 feet. In the event that the enforcement officer determines that it is necessary and expedient for the preservation of the public health, safety or welfare, he shall issue a notice to the property owner, occupant or operator to bring such property into compliance with the provisions of this chapter. In the event that the property owner, occupant or operator shall fail to comply within 10 days, the enforcement officer may take such action as may be reasonably required to bring such property into compliance with the provisions of this chapter, and the Borough shall be entitled to assert a lien upon the property for the costs of the same.
